Beat the Streets receives Canada Post Community Foundation support

Mississauga - Today, Beat the Streets (BTS) received \$12,144 from the Canada Post Community Foundation for an important project, You Grow Girl, in the Greater Toronto Area.

You Grow Girl is a fun and unique fitness and resiliency-building program that uses combat-sports to level up physical skills and experiential learning activities to level up the social-emotional skills of low-income girls ages 13-18.

This project will reach 80 girls in low-income communities. Starting in November, participants will learn the fundamentals of boxing and kickboxing to improve physical skills and confidence while learning tools and strategies to promote mental health and resilience.

"This grant creates more opportunities for low-income girls to learn tools and strategies to develop healthy bodies and minds and realize their full potential," said Neal Ewers, Executive Director of Beat the Streets.
